



Hello Christus Victor Family and Friends.

Life has been a whirlwind for me as of late. I really am trying to figure out what it means to be a part-time pastor. It is a little difficult with VBS and then Camp in the plan. However, as I sit on my couch after a very long but incredibly meaningful Sunday, I am at least learning to stay away from church physically a little better. One day, I will even know how to stay away from some of the work. Maybe.

In recent weeks I have had the opportunity to encounter several people who have had a significant impact on my ministry and my understanding of what it means to be called. Yet, they are individuals who a) probably have no idea the impact they have had, and b) I see so seldom that I may never have the chance to tell them, and c) I am not sure I could explain the impact if I tried. One of these individuals was at camp one of the very first years I went to camp as a sponsor. It was the first job I had out of college, and I was at camp with our pastor, working with our confirmation kids. She was the pastor of a church who also had confirmation kids at camp. I can't tell anything that she specifically said, or some deep conversation we had that created this intense connection for me. I can only say that she was one of the first people that made me feel that I did have much of I needed if I were to ever pursue becoming a Pastor. When I have the opportunity to see her, whether it is at a synod assembly or a Houston area meeting of some sort, I once again feel the empowered in my call.

One of these individuals I met when I was a counselor at camp. He was part of a group of pastors that gave us counselors a run for our money because, while they probably had the most productive way of working together to give the kids the best opportunity for learning, they also knew how to enjoy the time away from campers. Since I still know most of those pastors, most of whom are retired, I can say they did settle a bit in the rowdiness department, their ability to impact kids and adults alike is still huge. I had a chance to have a conversation or two with one of these guys in which I realized that I didn't have to have the skills or gifts someone else had to be called. I simply needed to be myself and let the Spirit of God channel my unique gifts and weirdness to places in ways that helped me connect with people. He ended up on the Candidacy Committee when I was in the TEEM program. This pastor supported me when another member of the implied that what I wrote was not genuine. When I see him, I feel that support and the importance of being nothing by myself when working in ministry.

There are others but I think I have painted the picture. The point in sharing this with you is twofold: A. To show you that each of us develops a sense of call with the help of other people. Some of those people are a huge part of our lives and we continue to see them, like parents, grandparents and old friends, ect. But sometimes we encounter people for a very short time, but the spirit of God reveals something so very important to us that empowers us to continue in the work God has called us to. B) To remind you that moments matter. We see t-shirts and buttons and signs that say things like "If you can be anything, be KIND". It's a slogan, but it really says it. There are thousands of people that we will encounter in moments when they are struggling or hurting or lonely, and we don't even know it. What we say to them can either offer things like support and encouragement or it could create things like frustration, anger or discomfort. A day from now you may not even remember that encounter. However, what you said may leave a significant impression, good or bad, that has an impact on their life for years to come.

Just read through the gospels and see how Jesus encounters the lost and the hurting. Kindness, compassion and grace are what Jesus gives, even the "worst" of the individuals. There really isn't a specific thing I am encouraging you to do. You don't have to go out of your comfort zone. All we need to do is be kind and trust that the Holy Spirit will be at work even in the shortest of encounters.
