The Season of Advent



Hello Christus Victor Family and Friends.

This coming Sunday, December 3 marks the first Sunday of Advent. The Paraments will be a beautiful Blue, reminiscent of the night sky which is the backdrop for the coming that will light the way for the visitors of the Christ child. The be stable will be placed in front of the Altar and we will slowly add characters until we are able to place the baby Jesus in the manger on Christmas Eve. At that time, the Wisemen will still be in the windows, slowly traveling to the Christ child which we will honor on Epiphany.

The Christmas tree will be standing tall in the Narthex. (Thank you Paul and Deb Davis for taking care of this chore). Google says this about the symbol of the Christmas Tree: "For many, the Christmas tree represents Jesus Christ's birth and resurrection. The tree branches and bushes are regarded as a sign of immortality and are thought to represent Christ's crown of thorns on the crucifixion." The ornaments that cover the tree are called Chrismons: "Chrismons, meaning "Christ monograms," traditionally are white and gold designs made from Christian symbols that signify Christ." If I don't forget before I am in the office on Wednesday, I am planning to make a little game out of finding different Chrismons on the tree. Feel free to call or text me to remind me on Wednesday.

One the of the biggest traditions our congregation has during Advent is our Wednesday evening Advent soup supper and worship service. I think that our Soup Suppers are legendary. From my very first Advent at Christus Victor, I have been overwhelmed by the variety and amount of soup that is made. I was surprised when we didn't have people sign up for each Wednesday. I wondered how we could be sure that we had enough soup. WELL.... If you have EVER been to a Christus Victor Soup Supper, you know that if there are 3 soups, we worry about having enough (though there has NEVER been "not enough"). It is not unusual for us to have as many as 6 or 7 soups. The big kicker is that they are all delicious, and sometime quite unique. Because we have so much soup each week, several years ago I made Pickle Soup on a whim, figuring that if it was awful, there would still be enough soup for everyone. Little did I know that it would become a requested soup for every Advent and Lent. Danuta made Borscht a couple of years which I would have never tried if it weren't for the Soup Supper evenings. Our Soup Suppers provide a great time of fellowship and an opportunity for individuals to share a bit of their own family traditions and heritage. It is a great set up for our Advent worship.

We almost always use Holden Evening Prayer for our Wednesday evening Liturgy. It is a beautiful liturgy of singing that our congregation is very familiar with. With individuals having the chance to be the leader of the liturgy if they would like, this service sets the tone of our season of anticipation. In recent years we have been using short videos to help us draw our attention to the Christ child with a few questions to ponder, and maybe a little editorial from me. This year our video series is "Songs of the Savior". Each week through the insight of different members of the Christmas story, a familiar Christmas song is used to help us get excited about the coming of our Lord, Emmanuel.

Soup Suppers and Advent worship are a great reason to invite a friend or neighbor, or even a stranger. The very relaxed nature of the dinners and the service are perfect for those who may or may not have an understanding of Liturgy. The dinner allows people to feel the open and welcoming nature of our congregation, and the service speaks for itself. Our first Advent Soup Supper and Worship service is on Wednesday, November 29th at 7 p.m.. We will be having the supper in our Fellowship hall until or unless the number of people attending gets too big. Wouldn't that be a great reason to move dinner back to the Family Life Center!!!!!

Let us enjoy the time of waiting and anticipating as we invite those we know to join us for wonderful dinners and beautiful 30 minute worship services!!!!

I can't wait to begin the anticipation.

Santa's little helpers make toys


Jesus makes new life, mends wounded hearts, repairs broken homes and builds mansions!
